## <u>President Marion Terenzio</u>

President Terenzio stated that many positive events have happened on campus. President Terenzio

- Showed a plaque signed by Senator Gillibrand and the American flag that was flown over the U.S. Capitol on April 8, 2016, in honor of her inauguration
  - There will be a future photo opportunity with student vets
- Discussed the potential partnership with Siena College ROTC
  - o Phase on is to reestablish the College's affiliate status with ROTC
  - o Phase two would entail offering the program on campus
- Discussed the meeting that occurred with the Schoharie County Strategic Plan Board
  - o They would like to include SUNY Cobleskill as a major player in the plan
- Discussed SUNY Cobleskill being a destination school
  - What it means to students, campus, and community
- Provided an enrollment Update:
  - o We should accomplish our May 1 deposit deadline
  - o Currently we are down by 50 students from same time last year
  - Many new initiatives are planned
    - o Capitalize on local students who haven't made a choice
    - o Accepted Student Day on June 3<sup>rd</sup>

- The Provost and Tara Winter discussed with departments their capacity and enrollment management projections
- o FASP has performed an audit on the 2012 prioritization document
- Informed the Council that the
  - o Retirement Incentive Plan deadline is June 1st
  - 2 new cohorts HVCC and Jefferson, Early Childhood
  - o The development of Pathways w/high schools; PTech
  - o The Micro-credentialing initiative will help us attain our SUNY Excels enrollment goal
  - o SUNY Cobleskill is hosting a Shared Services Revisited Summit
  - How it has helped, where we are now, what we have learned

# **Budget Update**

- o Presidents attended an emergency meeting called by the Chancellor
- o The state budget does not support SUNY
- o Chancellor is sending language to the state legislature
- o Tech colleges sent a memo to the Chancellor
- o President Terenzio has spoken with Senator Seward
